From Fr Sabu...

Lent is a season that calls us to renewal. Through true repentance of one's wrongdoings and through acts of penance each one of us take an extra effort to renew our life, bearing in mind that Christ came to this world to save me through his suffering, death and resurrection. During Lent and Advent, the Church offers us the opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation in a more prepared manner. If it has been a long time since you have received this sacrament, there is no need to be nervous! We participate in a reconciliation service together as a community. We then make our individual confession and receive our penance and absolution with a priest. You don't need to memorise any words to receive Christ's healing gift, though you are welcome to use the prayers set forth by the Church if that makes you more comfortable. Most importantly, remember that this is a sacrament of healing – it is not to cause shame, but to help you openly receive God's sacramental grace.

Bishop David M. O'Connell, C.M. said in his article about sacrament of penance: "Someone can say, 'I confess my sins only to God.' Yes, you can say to God, 'forgive me,' and say your sins. But our sins are also against our brothers, against the Church. This is why it is necessary to ask forgiveness of the Church and of our brothers, in the person of the priest. Forgiveness is not something we can give ourselves. One asks forgiveness, one asks it of another person, and in confession, we ask forgiveness from Jesus. Forgiveness is not a result of our efforts but is a gift. It is a gift of the Holy Spirit who showers us with mercy and grace that pours forth unceasingly from the open heart of Christ crucified and risen."

Let us make the best use of our Lenten practices and prepare ourselves to meet him. Let us not be idle in our sinfulness, rather take up the call to repent and renew. May each opportunity that we receive to repent and renew ourselves not be missed. Let us receive the gift of God's mercy always in our life.

<u>Altar Serving at Easter</u> – All servers are warmly encouraged to serve at any of our three churches this Easter, even if it's not their usual church. Sign-up sheets will be made available in each sacristy with all the dates and times for the Easter Masses. Please note that some Masses at Holy Trinity require a practice beforehand, and this will be indicated to servers (they will not be able to serve at these Masses if they haven't attended the practice). <u>Easter Collection</u> — The collection at Easter is your personal offering to your Priests and — together with the Christmas collection — is their main income for the year. Fr Sabu and Fr Saji know that 2024 so far has been difficult for some parishioners, and they are very thankful for your kindness and support. If you currently donate via standing order mandate, you will have to do a separate one with the reference "Easter Collection". If you are paying online or with QR codes, please make the reference "Easter Collection".

<u>Ask your MP to Support the Abortion Time Limit Reduction Amendment</u> – Support an amendment to reduce our abortion time limit from 24 weeks to 22 weeks. Research indicates that a significant number of babies born at 22 or 23 weeks can survive outside the womb and are thriving, leaving a contradiction in our abortion law. Please make sure you do <u>not</u> park on the pavement, double park or block people's driveways. Please park sensibly, legally and with sensitivity for our neighbours.

LiveSimply - Litter Picking

Over two million pieces of litter are dropped every day in the UK. This pollution mars our natural landscapes and has a far-reaching negative impact on wildlife. Plastics, metals, glass and other materials can stay in the environment for thousands of years and cause never-ending problems for the creatures we work so hard to protect.

To an unknowing animal, litter can be easily disguised as food. Plastics may cause choking, airway or stomach obstruction and lead to death. Tiny microplastics are also deadly as these build up in the bodies of our smaller creatures, impacting a whole host of animals as they pass through the food chain. The tiny plastics ruin our wildlife's immune functions, genetics, lifespan, feeding habits and general health. It's estimated that 99% of our seabird species will be ingesting plastics by 2050.

Empty food jars and containers are deadly traps. Sharp objects like hard plastics, glass and metals scattered in the environment cause wounds. Keep Britain Tidy estimated that 2.9 million small mammals - like shrews, hedgehogs and voles - are dying each year after getting stuck in discarded bottles and cans.

What can we do? We can recycle, reduce and re-use wherever possible. If throwing something away is unavoidable, reduce the impact on the environment by cutting through things like plastic loops or bands. Instead of releasing balloons or sky lanterns to mark special occasions, go for more wildlife-friendly choices like planting flowers or taking a memory walk somewhere meaningful. If you want to take a more active role, join a local litter picking group, attend organised events or sign up to the Essex Wildlife Trust's Spring Pickers. The idea is that you collect at least five pieces of litter every day for ten days (9th-18th March). You can plot your picks on the map on the website: www.essexwt.org.uk/get-involved/campaign/spring-pickers.


